

His will. His way. My Jaith.

IEREMIAH 29:11

"Everyone Who Calls Upon the Name of the Lord Shall Be Saved." by Peter J. Weller

All of the New Testament lessons for August are from the book of Romans, and this month's column will look specifically at the 10th chapter. Paul wrote, "Moses writes concerning the righteousness that comes from the law, that 'the person who does these things will live by them.' But, the righteousness that comes from faith says, 'Do not say in your heart, "Who will ascend into heaven?" '(that is, to bring Christ down) or "who will descend into the abyss?" '(that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). But what does it say?

"'The word is near you, on your lips and in your heart' (that is, the word of faith which we proclaim); because if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, then you will be saved. For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved. the scripture says, 'No one who believes in him will be put to shame.' For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all and is generous to all who call on him. For, 'Everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.'" (Romans 10:5-13)

In verses 5-7, Paul paraphrases Moses' writings in Leviticus 18:5, "You shall keep my statutes and my ordinances; by doing so one shall live: I am the LORD.", and in Deuteronomy 30:11-14, "Surely, this commandment that I am commanding you today is not too hard for you, nor is it too far away. It is not in heaven, that you should say, 'Who will go up to heaven for us, and get it for us so that we may hear it and observe it?' Neither is it beyond the sea that you should say, 'Who will cross to the other side of the sea for us, and get it for us so that we may hear it and observe it?' No, the word is very near to you; it is in your mouth and in your heart for you to observe."

What Paul is saying is that we do not need to search in heaven or in the depths to find God and the word of faith. Paul writes that God is not far away, remote, distant, and hard to reach. Rather, God "is near you, on your lips and in your heart." Paul assures us further that "If you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, then you will be saved." (Romans 10:9)

August 2020, LSI Bulletin/Newsletter Article and Story

Back to School Month School is right around the corner! This year's back-to-school time feels a little different than usual for all of us, but imagine what it would be like to be a child or teen with an emotional or behavioral disorder. For the last several months, their routine has been turned upside-down and they've learned to adjust to a new way of life. Moving back into a school year structure can be particularly stressful and it can be difficult to concentrate and cope. Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI) provides mental health services to children and families across the state. It's our job to relate to children who might feel alone or misunderstood. Our therapists provide virtual telehealth therapy sessions with children while our Behavioral Health Intervention Services team collaborates with families virtually or in a community setting to help them develop skills like anger management and healthy decision-making. LSI also provides 24-hour mental health care at the Bremwood and Beloit Residential Treatment Centers in Waverly and Ames to empower Iowa's most vulnerable children and teens. We thank you for your support of LSI's mission as we respond together to the love of Jesus Christ through compassionate service! We know there are more Iowa children in need of this critical care. We are Still Here: LSI's Therapy Services When LSI's workforce began working remote as a COVID-19 precaution, therapist Andrea knew she would need to adjust to a new way of providing therapy to the clients she serves. In particular, one individual she met with struggled with anxiety on a daily basis. With the pandemic, however, her anxiety deepened and she spiraled to levels she hadn't encountered in years. And she was afraid she would no longer be able to see Andrea and receive the weekly therapy she'd relied on. But that wasn't stopping Andrea. She set up a home office where she could provide telehealth virtual therapy sessions to all her clients in need of the same consistent care they were used to. Andrea used this time to work with her client on self-care strategies, coping skills, and mindfulness to help her client stay grounded when she felt anxious. Andrea's client now has the tools she needs to handle the difficult days through this crisis, and Andrea is able to continue providing life-changing serves to Iowa children, adults, and families in her community.

How does one come to know God? Martin Luther wrote in his Small Catechism: "I believe that by my own understanding or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him, but instead the Holy Spirit has called me through the gospel, enlightened me with his gifts, made me holy and kept me in the true faith, just as he calls, gathers, enlightens, and makes holy the whole Christian church on earth and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one common, true faith. Daily in this Christian church the Holy Spirit abundantly forgives all sins—mine and those of all believers. On the last day the Holy Spirit will raise me and all the dead and will give to me and all believers in Christ eternal life. This is most certainly true."

Luther's commentary, above, tells us that knowing God and his son, Jesus, is not an intellectual exercise. It has been my experience that God is not found or experienced through the senses. God is not seen with the eyes nor heard with the ears. Rather, God is experienced through the heart—not the biological heart, of course, but the spiritual heart. There have been times in my life when I have truly believed that God has been in the room with me, that God has even spoken to me, though I did not hear God with my ears. I truly believe that one will know when God is speaking to them. It will be unmistakable. Therefore, it is important that while in prayer and in communion that we listen for God's voice.

Referencing Isaiah 28:16 and Joel 2:32, Paul concludes, "[T]he scripture says, 'No one who believes in him will be put to shame.' For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all and is generous to all who call on him. For, 'Everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.'"

Paul S. Berge, Emeritus Professor of New Testament, Luther Seminary, St. Paul, Minnesota, wrote in Working Preacher, "The confession, 'Jesus is Lord . . . God raised him from the dead,' is the word that saves and justifies. Attending this is the promise of scripture: 'No one who believes in him will be put to shame' (10:11). Paul cites the second half of Isaiah 28:16, to proclaim that God's promise of salvation is for all. There is only one promise, one people, one Lord: 'There is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord of all and is generous to all who call on him' (10:12).

"'Jesus is Lord,' is the earliest Christian confession. The promise that attends this confession is now expressed: 'Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved' (10:13). To believe in Jesus Christ as Lord (10:11) and to call on the name of the Lord (10:13) continues the confessional focus of these verses."

The 2020 Synod Assembly will be ONLINE ONLY

The Southeastern Iowa Synod Council approved a plan to move the 2020 Synod Assembly to a format that is entirely online. The Synod Council made this decision on Saturday, July 18th.

This meeting of the synod assembly will be convened at 4:00 pm on August 5, 2020, and again at 9:30 am August 7, 2020. The primary



business of this meeting will include the adoption of the 2021 budget, and the elections of a new synod bishop, a new synod vice president, several synod council and committee members.

Immanuel's voting members are Ron and Char Andersen and Pastor Howard. Margaret Stangohr was initially elected, with Ron, at Immanuel's 2019 Annual meeting. Prior to the knowledge that the meeting would be held virtually, Margaret told council that she was removing herself as voting member due to COVID concerns. Council elected Char Andersen, as Margaret's replacement, during the July Council meeting. Anyone who is not a voting member will be able to watch the assembly online on the synod's website https://seiasynod.org/ or Facebook page.

August Bulletins

Immanuel will be using a different bulletin during the month of August. To fully participate in live streaming or conference call of worship download the August bulletin from Immanuel's website, luthwash.org. The bulletin is located at the "August Bulletin" tab. The August bulletin has different hymns, the weekly scripture texts, the blessing of educators and students liturgy (August 23^{rd}), Baptismal liturgy (August 23^{rd}), the Holy Communion liturgy (August 23^{rd}).

A different bulletin will be used for our outdoor worship on Sundays, August 2nd and 23rd, 7 p.m. The bulletin for the outdoor service will also be available at Immanuel's website luthwash.org for you to download. No bulletins will be printed and available for you during this evening worship.

Car Hop Communion: Sunday, August 23rd

Pastor Howard will be serving Holy Communion on **Sunday, August 23rd, 10:30 a.m. – 11 a.m.** under the portico in the church's parking lot. 59 people where nourished with the presence of Christ at the Car Hop Communion on Sunday, July 19th.

Pastor Howard will consecrate the elements (wafers, wine, and grape juice) during the live stream/conference call worship, 9 a.m. Pastor Howard will be wearing a face shield when consecrating the elements and during distribution. The common cup will not be available only individual, plastic cups. Cars will enter the parking lot through the North entrance and exit through the West entrance. Pastor Howard will give you Holy Communion while you remain in your cars. You will then drive to the garbage can and throw away your plastic cup(s). However, if you chose not to participate in this meal opportunity, fasting is still an appropriate option.



Story Time with Pastor Maureen, 10 a.m., ON BREAK

Pastor Howard will be on vacation during August and will not be live streaming Story Time with Pastor Maureen. She will resume story time on September 3rd, 10 a.m., with stories of the Old Testament. Enjoy past readings anytime you like as they remain on Immanuel's Facebook. These stories are NOT just intended for children, adults are learning the stories of the Bible too!

LIVE Streaming of Worship or Conference Call options

Until further notice, Immanuel is live streaming our Sunday worship at 9 a.m. Streaming is going to Immanuel's Facebook page: Immanuel Lutheran Washington Iowa. Brian Lueck is also putting it on Immanuel's website: https://luthwash.org. You may go back to these locations and the video will still be available. We are reaching people across the country who are choosing to worship with us!

If you choose not to use the streaming of worship, you may conference call in. Call this number: (319) 656-2663 and it will ask you for a participant code 344238#. Then you will be connected to the church phone and Pastor Howard will have it next to her during worship. This phone line will be opened at 8:50 a.m. on Sundays and it will end at the conclusion of worship. HOWEVER, when you use the conference call option, know that all talking you do is heard by the other participants on the conference call. If you begin talking to other people in your home, then all the people on the phone hear your conversation and not the worship service.

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF REPORT

Immanuel's OUTDOOR Summer Worship

We will have two more outdoor worship services in August on Immanuel's East lawn **Sundays August 2nd and 23rd, 7 p.m.** The COVID-19 virus has not yet been eradicated from our lives, so worship will be celebrated with COVID-19 precautions. Being together is safer in the outdoors rather than inside, thus an outdoor worship service. Knowing that this is summer we will worship in the evening, 7 p.m., on the East lawn where shade will be plentiful. Ushers will seat you on the lawn, keeping distance between worshipers. The bulletin (a different bulletin from the Sunday morning live stream services) will be on the church website for you to use via your phone or print and bring for yourselves (no bulletins will be provided for you). Passing of Christ's Peace will be extended by remaining at your seats and bowing to one another. Four offering plate stations will be available for the receiving of your tithes and offerings of thanksgiving. You may deposit your monetary gifts to God upon arrival or departure from worship (offering plates will not be passed). At the conclusion of worship, the ushers will dismiss you, by family unit, to return to your vehicles and leave worship. Please note, that our "new normal" live stream and conference call of worship at 9 a.m. will still take place on August 2nd and 23rd. The same sermon will be preached at 9 a.m. as 7 p.m.
