

The first gospel lesson for August is from John 6:24-40: "So when the crowd saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there [at the place where five thousand had been fed], they themselves got into the boats and went to Capernaum looking for Jesus. When they found him on the other side of the sea, they said to him, 'Rabbi, when did you come here?' Jesus answered them, 'Very truly, I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves. Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For it is on him that God the Father has set his seal.' Then they said to him, 'What must we do to perform the works of God?' Jesus answered them, 'This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent.' So they said to him, 'What sign are you going to give us then, so that we may see it and believe you? What work are you performing? Our ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written, "He gave them bread from heaven to eat." 'Then Jesus said to them, 'Very truly, I tell you, it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.' They said to him, 'Sir, give us this bread always.'

"Jesus said to them, 'I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty. But I said to you that you have seen me and yet you do not believe. Everything that the Father gives me will come to me, and anyone who comes to me I will never drive away; for I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will, but the will of him who sent me. . . . This is indeed the will of my Father, that all who see the Son and believe in him may have eternal life; and I will raise them up on the last day."

So, here we have the story of the crowds looking for Jesus, the Miracle Worker, after he had fed five thousand people with only five loaves and two fish. What were they looking for? Spectacle? A magic show? Another free meal? Maybe all of these. Jesus suspected as much. Doubtless, the word had spread about Jesus healing sick people. He now just demonstrated that he can feed them, too, with next to nothing in terms of supplies on hand. What else is he capable of? People wanted to know. Perhaps they were also trying to figure out how he did it.

August 2021, LSI Bulletin/Newsletter Article and Story

Back to School Month School is right around the corner! This time of year can be exciting and stressful for many of us, but adjusting back into a classroom routine can be especially difficult for kids and teens with emotional or behavioral disorders. Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI) provides mental and behavioral health services for children and families across the state. Our therapists provide virtual and in-person therapy sessions with children, while our Behavioral Health Intervention Services (BHIS) team collaborates with families in their home or in a community setting to help them develop skills like anger management and healthy decision making. LSI also provides 24-hour mental health care at the Bremwood and Beloit Residential Treatment Centers in Waverly and Ames to empower Iowa children and teens. Helping Families Adjust to a New Normal Uriyah felt overwhelmed by anxiety. During the pandemic, it was hard for him to even leave his room, talk to his family, and attend school. When classes moved online, he felt comfortable completing his homework and attending classes virtually. But when it was time to return to school for in-person classes, he would not attend. His mom, Holly, wanted him to be able to finish the school year virtually, but she needed help navigating the transition with his school. That's when she learned about LSI's STEP IN community program. Through the service, LSI social workers are there to build on a family's strengths and ensure children and parents have what they need to thrive and create a brighter future. Children and teens in the program work with their LSI team to develop coping skills, conflict resolution, and healthy communication. The LSI team helped Uriyah feel more comfortable engaging with his family, and Holly had the support she needed to work with the school, advocate for her child, and ensure Uriyah could finish the school year online. Now, Uriyah has felt a weight lifted off his shoulders, and he successfully graduated out of LSI programming. The last year has created unprecedented stress and anxiety for many children and teens, but Uriyah now feels more comfortable and confident moving forward.

Yet, clearly, this is not Jesus' response when he sees the crowds coming toward him. He questioned their motivations for seeking him out, and urged them to look beyond the food that perishes. Instead, he told them to look for the food that endures for eternal life. On the subject of manna, the heavenly food that God provided to the Israelites as they were starving in the wilderness, Jesus told them, "[I]t was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." Note that John changes the tense of the verb from past to present, from "gave" to "gives".

Susan Hylen, Associate Professor of New Testament at Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia, writes in Working Preacher, "At this point Jesus identifies himself with the present gift of manna God is giving to the world: 'I am the bread of life' (John 6:35). This is the first of Jesus' seven 'I am' sayings, each of which elaborates an important aspect of Jesus' identity. These sayings most often draw on Old Testament imagery to understand Jesus."

In John's gospel, Jesus continues, "Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty. . . . [A]nyone who comes to me I will never drive away; for I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will, but the will of him who sent me. . . . This is indeed the will of my Father, that all who see the Son and believe in him may have eternal life. (John 6:35-40)

Not everyone in that crowd was convinced that Jesus was, indeed, the Son of God the Father. They looked for signs. They looked for proof. They looked for some spectacular act that would convince them once and for all. And, Jesus knew that.

But, Christians do believe that he was, and that he is. If you listen carefully to these verses, you will hear Jesus say, "I am the bread of life. I have come down from heaven. Anyone who comes to me I will never drive away. All who see the Son and believe in him may have eternal life." These words bring comfort and assurance and hope to the believer. Jesus is true. Jesus can be trusted. In Jesus, we will never be spiritually hungry or thirsty.
