An Interview with Peter Weller on His Twelve Years of Exploring Scripture for this Newsletter

When Peter Weller reported that he was no longer able to do the Immanuel Newsletter monthly article based on a Scripture reading---as a member of this congregation, I, Fran Victor, did not want this to happen. As I reflected on the reality of the change that was about to occur, I wanted us as congregational participants to learn from his years of experience. I interviewed him on the morning of October 11.

Peter spoke with sadness about how complicated health issues causing low energy and the lack of time has resulted in his no longer being able to continue. When I asked him to share his experience, a smile came and he shifted to discussing his "enjoyment" of scripture. He noted that 12 years ago when he was ready to say "No", a second request from Mary Gail Lyons brought forth a "Yes". Peter said, "As a teacher, I became a learner and my biblical horizons broadened especially regarding the Old Testament. I had to "push into the unfamiliar." He soon had ideas and then he began to use internet resources such as the "working preacher" with perspectives from theological and biblical scholars.

Peter Weller's second "enjoyment" was coming to appreciate the Psalms of David. "You feel the intensity of David's feelings, this man who loved the Lord and was no saint. 'All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, Romans 3:23. None of us can scold David." Peter then spoke of his own faith as "feeling God in my gut" and like Luther knowing it is "by grace we are saved through faith," Ephesians 2:8.

A third delight for Peter was the teenagers he related to in Scripture. First, from the Old Testament---Joseph and his brothers, and how the memories of events in our adolescent years stay vivid, perhaps even more so as we reach our elder years. And John, the disciple of Jesus, was probably a teenager when he followed Jesus and wrote the Gospel of John in his elder years. Finally, Peter depended on the Holy Spirit. When he struggled to find an idea, one would "pop into my mind"; then he would say to himself "how did that happen" and realized we cannot come to God on our own and that the Spirit was actively assisting him.

A Picture of Foster Care and Adoption

The goal of foster care is to reunite children with the parents when possible. The foster family can play an integral part in making that happen, often becoming mentors to the birth parents, helping them learn parenting skills they may not have had modeled to them. An LSI provider told me about a picture she had recently received. Imagine, if you would, a photo of two women, one on each end of a bench, and four kids with them. All happy. All smiling. It looks like they were enjoying a beautiful day in the park.

On the left is the birth mother of those kids. She will be the first to admit, things haven't been easy – but she loves these kids.

The other woman is the foster mother. She loves these kids too. Two of the kids were adopted by the foster family, one lives with the birth mom, and the foster child on the mother's lap was soon to be reunited with the birth mom. They are celebrating Mother's Day together.

Foster families provide more than a safe place for children to land. This foster/adoptive parent is a wonderful mentor for this birth mom!
