

In 2024, SNAP benefits provided 99 millions meals across 7 counties, including Washington. On November 1st, those benefits may not come to hundreds and thousands of our neighbors. We do have food banks in our county, but they are only equipped to fill in the gaps, not to be a primary food source. The food pantries across the same seven counties provided 11 million meals last year. A coalition of Washington country citizens would like you to realize the we have the power to make a difference in our neighbor's lives, right now. For every \$1 donated to the Food Reservoir, the main source of food for HACAP and all of the food pantries in our county, 5 meals can be bought. We are asking for donations that will be delivered directly to HACAP. The money will be used to buy meals for those who are currently hungry and for those who may, in a week, find themselves with no resources to feed their families. We are asking now, so that the food will be available on November 1st if the benefits are not released. If the SNAP benefits are released, the food pantries have a jump start on Thanksgiving. You may notice other actions around the county also to help feed our neighbors. Volunteer at one of the many food pantries if you can. It will take us all to make up for millions of missed meals. Luke 3:11 And he answered them, "Whoever has two tunics is to share with him who has none, and whoever has food is to do likewise."

We were blessed to have Yaro and Mary Chmelar and Ron and Char Andersen set off to Cedar Rapids with their vans fully packed on October 18, 2025. They delivered 90 quilts, 47 health/personal care kits, 22 baby layette kits and 104 school kits for Lutheran World Relief. A check to help shipping cost in the amount of \$50.00 was also included.

The school kits were gathered and packed by our Faith Formation students and teachers. The rest was created and packed by the 5 women of H.O.P.E. being Wilma McKinstry, Doris Moore, Georgean Roffman, Jane Kruse and Deb Simmering (with some help from Dave Simmering as well.) We are a small group, but mighty and would love to have any and all help possible. We inherited enough boxes and boxes of sheets and material that Nancy Baker had accumulated for us, to create quilts for several years to come!

Several people have also contributed by using their Thrivent Cards to purchase the batting that goes inside of the quilts.

We have been blessed to be able to help people with needs for these kits throughout the world for a long time and pray that this service will continue for years to come!

Let's surround our youth with prayer and encouragement as they grow in faith and face life's challenges together. [2]


